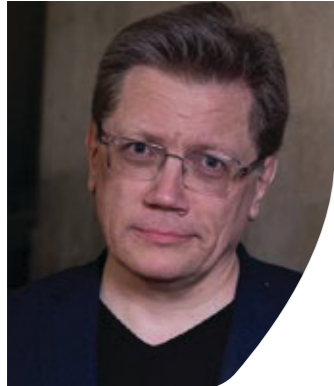

About the Contest
– icpc.global

The ICPC International Collegiate Programming Contest is the premiere global programming competition conducted by and for the world's universities. The ICPC operates under the auspices of the ICPC Foundation which hosts ICPC Global Headquarters. We shine the spotlight on the students, coaches, universities, industry, and communities working to advance prospects of prosperity through team-based, algorithmic competitive programming.

For over four decades, the ICPC has grown to be a game-changing global competitive educational program that has raised aspirations and performance of generations of the world's problem solvers in the computing sciences and engineering. With 400,000 alumni, The ICPC community spans the globe with recent annual participation levels reaching 111 countries, 3,450 universities, and 75,000 team members, coaches and volunteers.

The ICPC community purpose remains at the heart of the ICPC: to advance prospects for the next generation, by bringing students together, working collaboratively to solve algorithmically challenging problems, preparing them to build dependable systems that benefit their neighbors with the support of universities, industry, and community leaders, globally. With ICPC principles, "Put people first.," "Practice goodwill.," and "Follow the Golden Rule.," the doors are open for students from all universities to compete in ICPC regional competitions with the opportunity to advance to the ICPC World Finals.

ICPC World Finals host institutions offer hospitality comparable to visiting grandma's house with special assistance to obtain passports and visas so that all who qualify may participate. The 45th ICPC World Finals in Dhaka, hosted by the University of Asia Pacific, will continue over four decades of global inclusion advancing participants of any race, ethnicity, gender, religion, or nationality who qualify.

In ICPC competitions, teams of three students represent their universities in multiple levels of regional competition. Volunteer coaches prepare their teams with intense training and instruction in algorithms, programming, and teamwork strategy. Several ICPC universities and ICPC volunteers provide online judging systems, free of charge. Top teams from regional competitions held on six continents advance to the ICPC World Championship round of the ICPC World Finals, hosted by University of Asia Pacific (UAP) on 10 November, 2022, in Dhaka, Bangladesh.



The ICPC traces its roots to a competition held at Texas A&M in 1970 hosted by the Alpha Chapter of the UPE Computer Science Honor Society. The idea quickly gained popularity within the United States and Canada as an innovative initiative to raise the aspirations, performance, and opportunity of the top students in the emerging field of computer science.

The contest evolved into a multi-tier competition with the first Finals held at the ACM Computer Science Conference in 1977. Operating under the auspices of the ICPC Foundation, the contest has expanded into a global network of universities hosting regional competitions that advance teams to the ICPC World Finals. In the past 25 years alone, ICPC participation has increased by more than 2000%.



The contest fosters creativity, teamwork, and innovation in building new software programs, and enables students to test their ability to perform under pressure. Quite simply, it is the oldest, largest, and most prestigious programming contest in the world and the root of competitive programming competitions the world over.

The annual event is comprised of several levels of competition:

- Local Contests – Universities choose teams or hold local contests to select one or more teams to represent them at the next level of competition. Selection takes place from a field of over 300,000 students in computing disciplines worldwide.
- Regional Contests – Annually, ICPC Regional Contests include participants from 111 countries, with 3,450 universities, 75,000 volunteers, coaches, and team members involved.
- World Finals – November 6-11, 2022 in Dhaka, Bangladesh – Hosted by University of Asia Pacific (UAP), the ICPC World Finalist teams will compete for awards, prizes, and bragging rights. These teams represent the best of great universities on six continents - the cream of the crop.

Battle of the Brains

The contest pits teams of three university students against eight or more complex, real-world problems, with a grueling five-hour deadline. Huddled around a single computer, competitors race against the clock in a battle of logic, strategy, and mental endurance.

Teammates collaborate to rank the difficulty of the problems, deduce the requirements, design test beds, and build software systems that solve the problems under the intense scrutiny of expert judges. For a well-versed computer science student, some of the problems require precision only. Others require a knowledge and understanding of advanced algorithms. Still others are simply too hard to solve – except, of course, for the world's brightest problem-solvers.

Judging is relentlessly strict. The students are given a problem statement – not a requirements document. They are given an example of test data, but they do not have access to the judges' test data and acceptance criteria. Each incorrect solution submitted is assessed a time penalty. You don't want to waste your customer's time when you are dealing with the supreme court of computing. The team that solves the most problems in the fewest attempts in the least cumulative time is declared the winner.

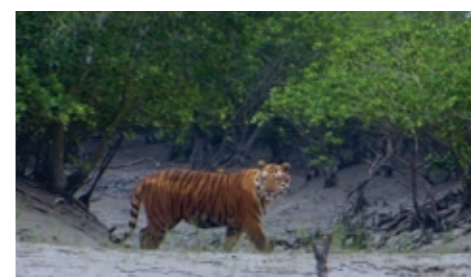

About the World Finals Host Country

Bangladesh, a country of South Asia, located in the delta of the Padma (Ganges) and Jamuna (Brahmaputra) rivers in the northeastern part of the Indian subcontinent. Civilization in the Bengal Delta dates back more than 4,300 years. The borders of present-day Bangladesh were established during the British partition of Bengal and India in 1947 when the region became East Pakistan, part of the newly formed state of Pakistan. It was separated from West Pakistan by 1,600 km of Indian territory. Due to a desire for political, economic, and linguistic self-determination, popular agitation and civil disobedience grew against the Pakistani state. This culminated in the Bangladesh Liberation War of 1971. The People's Republic of Bangladesh was founded as a constitutional, secular, democratic, multiparty, parliamentary republic. The Bangladesh story is about a man named Sheikh Mujibur Rahman who sacrificed his life for a country he had named "Bangladesh."



Bangladesh has an impressive track record of growth and poverty reduction. It has been among the fastest growing economies in the world over the past decade, supported by a demographic dividend, strong ready-made garment (RMG) exports, and stable macroeconomic conditions. Continued recovery in exports and consumption will help growth rates pick up to 6.4 percent in the fiscal year 2021-22. Bangladesh tells the world a remarkable story of poverty reduction and development. From being one of the poorest nations at birth in 1971, with per capita GDP tenth lowest in the world, Bangladesh reached a lower-middle-income status in 2015. It is on track to graduate from the UN's Least Developed Countries (LDC) list in 2026.

Bangladesh is home to the world's largest river delta, roaming Bengal tigers in the Sundarbans, a mangrove and swampland in the delta, the longest natural uninterrupted sea beach in Asia (Cox's Bazar beach), which is 150 km long, the Malnicherra Tea Estate, the oldest tea garden in the subcontinent, ancient historical Panam City, Ilish fish and Muslin gauze like Jamdani.



About the World Finals Host City

Dhaka is Bangladesh's capital and largest city. It is the largest city by population in the historical region of Bengal and a major city in South Asia. It is a hub for trade and culture, with a long history as a Bengali capital. It has been called the City of Mosques and the Venice of the East due to its Islamic architecture and a riverfront facing the Buriganga River. It is also known as the Rickshaw Capital of the World, as there are over 500,000 cycle rickshaws running on its roads.

As the center of Bangladesh's independence movements, Dhaka also hosts some significant national monuments and structures. A number of annual cultural events are held in Dhaka, like Pohela Falgun, Pohela Baishakh, and Ekushe Book Fair, which add a unique flavor to the city.



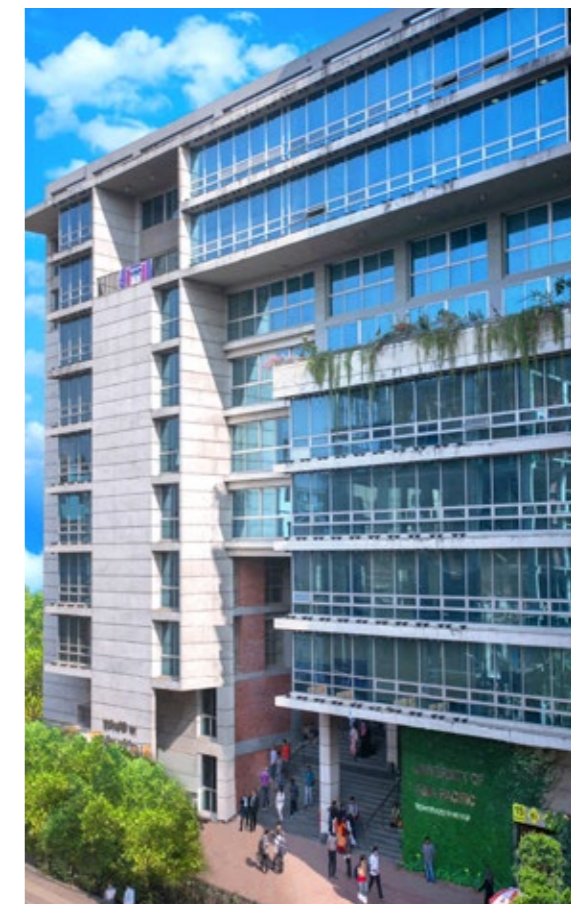

Dinner is hosted by the ICPC World Finals Dhaka Host University of Asia Pacific to welcome all registered attendees.

It's a great way to learn about new technologies and innovative practices directly from industry visionaries. Try to solve challenges that top companies are working on, meet your future colleagues, listen to presentations from top industry leaders, and discover future job trends and opportunities.

ICPC Challenge powered by Huawei

The ICPC Challenge powered by Huawei is a required activity that presents a problem from some domains in computing. The domain and problem style may be very different from the standard ICPC problems. This contest provides ICPC participants the opportunity to learn about and experience leading-edge issues in computing, typically of contemporary interest to industry. ICPC World Finals Dhaka Rules

Mission

The International Collegiate Programming Contest (ICPC) provides college students with opportunities to interact with students from other universities and to sharpen and demonstrate their problem-solving, programming, and teamwork skills. The contest provides a platform for industry, and academia to encourage and focus public attention on the next generation of computing professionals as they pursue excellence. (from the ICPC Policies and Procedures)

Introduction

The contest is a two-tiered competition among teams of students representing institutions of higher education. Teams first compete in Regional Contests, held around the world from September to December each year. Based on their performance in Regional Contests, top-ranking teams advance to the International Collegiate Programming Contest World Finals. Additional high-ranking teams may be invited to the World Finals. At most 140 teams will be invited to compete onsite. These rules are subject to change.

Organization

The ICPC is organized according to the *ICPC Policies and Procedures*. The Executive Committee, chaired by the Executive Director, sets the policy and general rules for the conduct of the contest. The Executive Director is solely responsible for interpreting the rules and for ruling on unforeseen situations.

Team Requirements

Teams qualify to advance to the World Finals through Regional Contests. See the ICPC Regional Rules and Region-Specific Rules for details on advancing to the World Finals. Only one team from a given institution may advance to the World Finals. No team member on the qualifying team may have competed as a contestant in two previous World Finals.

The coach of a qualifying team is the point of contact before and during World Finals activities. A contestant of a team may not serve as the coach. The coach must complete certification at the Team Certification Web Site within five (5) business days of notification. Qualifying teams will be invited by email and postal mail (if requested) soon after completing certification.

All team members attending the team's institution on visas must be permitted to return to their point of origin after the World Finals. Qualifying teams requiring visas must initiate the process of applying for visas within 10 business days of being invited to apply for a visa. Teams failing to comply with any of these requirements will be ruled ineligible to compete in the World Finals. Upon completion of these requirements, a qualifying team will be advanced to the World Finals.

A team advancing to the World Finals will comprise the same

three members as when it qualified. (Reserves are not allowed at the Finals.) If a team member is unwilling, unable, or unfit to compete in the World Finals, the coach must notify the ICPC Contest Manager in a timely manner. A team member who is unwilling or unfit to compete in the World Finals will be disqualified from further ICPC competitions. The team member may appeal disqualification to the Appeals Committee.

At on-site registration, participants must provide a picture ID (passport, driver's license, etc). Contestants must show proof of enrollment at the university during the term of the regional contest at which they qualified. A letter on university stationery with the signature of a university official accompanied by an English translation is sufficient.

Due to COVID, exceptions to these rules take precedence. All team members are responsible to follow all health safety rules.

Attendance

Finalists must attend all required events from On-Site Registration to Celebration as indicated in the Schedule of Events. Failure to attend any required event will result in disqualification and forfeiture of scholarships and prizes. Coaches must be accessible during On-Site Registration, Dress Rehearsal, the World Finals Championship, and the Closing Ceremony.

Support and Prizes

Each finalist team will be provided with hotel accommodations for the coach and three contestants according to dates published on ICPC Invitations. The hotel accommodations will provide gender privacy. The teams and coaches will be treated to a full schedule of activities including a full course of complimentary food functions.

Transportation to the World Finals is the responsibility of the finalists. The ICPC encourages teams to raise funds for transportation and extracurricular activities from local sources to better strengthen community ties among academia, industry, and government.

Teams finishing in the top four positions will be awarded Gold Medals. Those teams finishing fifth through eighth place will be awarded Silver Medals. Those teams finishing ninth through the twelfth place will receive Bronze Medals. Additional Bronze Medals may be awarded to teams solving the same number of problems as the twelfth place team and in a total elapsed time no more than 60 minutes more than the twelfth place team. Such teams will be awarded twelfth place.

The highest-ranked team is the World Champion and will receive the World Champion Cup and plaques. The remaining teams through twelfth place, as well as the Africa & Middle East Champions, the Asia East Champions, the Asia Pacific Champions, the Asia West Champions, the Europe Champions, the Latin America Champions, the Northern Eurasia Champions, and the North America Champions will also receive plaques.

Conduct of the Finals

Ten or more problems have been posed in recent World Finals.

Problems will be posed in English. During the contest, all communications from contest officials to contestants will be in English. Each team may identify an interpreter for translating questions posed by contestants to contest officials. Contestants may bring electronic natural language translators provided that they do not support math operations.

Solutions to problems submitted for judging are called runs. Each run is judged as accepted or rejected, and the team is notified of the results. Rejected runs will be marked as follows:

- run-time error
- time-limit exceeded
- wrong answer



Notification of accepted runs may be suspended at the appropriate time to keep the final results secret. A general announcement to that effect will be made during the contest. Notification of rejected runs will continue until the end of the contest.

A contestant may submit a claim of ambiguity or error in a problem statement by submitting a clarification request. If the Judges agree that an ambiguity or error exists, a clarification will be issued.

The competition is scheduled to last five hours. The Finals Director has the authority to lengthen the contest in the event of unforeseen circumstances. Should the Contest duration be altered, every attempt will be made to notify contestants in a timely and uniform manner.

Scoring of the Finals

The World Finals Judges are solely responsible for determining the correctness of submitted runs. In consultation with the World Finals Judges, the Director of Judging is responsible for determining the winners of the World Finals. They are empowered to adjust for or adjudicate unforeseen events and conditions. Their decisions are final.

Teams are ranked according to the most problems solved. Teams placing in the first twelve places who solve the same number of problems are ranked first by least total time and, if need be, by the earliest time of submission of the last accepted run.

The total time is the sum of the time consumed for each problem solved. The time consumed for a solved problem is the time elapsed from the beginning of the contest to the submission of the first accepted run plus 20 penalty minutes for every previously rejected run for that problem. There is no time consumed

for a problem that is not solved.

Computing Environment

The World Finals programming language tools include Java, C, C++, Kotlin, and Python3. See the [Programming Environment Web Site](#) for detailed configuration information. Before the World Finals, the judges will have solved all problems in languages from at least two of the three distinct language groups (Java/Kotlin, C/C++, and Python3).

Each team will be provided with one computer. All teams will have equivalent computing equipment.

Contestants may not bring any printed materials or machine-readable versions of software or data to the Contest Area. Contestants may not bring their own computers, computer terminals, calculators, or other electronic devices to the Contest Area.

Each team member may bring an unannotated natural language printed dictionary. Online reference materials will be made available as described in the Reference Materials section of the [Programming Environment Web Site](#). Each team will be permitted three copies of the **Team Reference Document** described in the [On-Site Registration Instructions](#).

Contestant Conduct

DO NOT TOUCH ANYTHING at the team workstations until so directed by the Finals Director.

Contestants are not to converse with anyone except members of their team and personnel designated by the Finals Director. Systems support staff may advise contestants on system-related problems such as explaining system error messages.

A team may be disqualified by the Finals Director for any activity that jeopardizes the World Finals such as dislodging extension cords, unauthorized modification of contest materials, distracting behavior, or behavior contrary to the ICPC Code of Ethics and Overview.

Participant Conduct

Any participant may be disqualified from further participation due to any activity that compromises an ICPC event or due to behavior that is not in harmony with the ICPC Code of Ethics and Overview.

About the Host City





Dhaka

the story of an ever-sprawling city!

Dhaka as an urban center of Bangladesh has its deep roots in history. The city's rise and fall bears witness to not only this part of the Indian subcontinent but also to the history of Europe. From a relatively obscure position in the ancient time, Dhaka rose to eminence in the early 17th century as the capital of Mughal province of Bengal, Bihar, and Orissa and the most dominant urban center of eastern India. Since then, the history of Dhaka has been one of outstanding economic, social, and cultural progress, as well as decline and degeneration. The pre-Mughal Dhaka was indeed a very old settlement of mostly traders and artisans with a small contingent of officials and religious leaders. It truly exhibits the characteristics of urbanization in the riverine Bengal. Rising on the banks of river Buriganga, Dulai Khal and other small channels, Dhaka formed a center of exchange for trade and manufactures. The forces which led to this growth of urban Dhaka were primarily administration, internal and international trade and commerce, manufactures, and culture.

Dhaka thus became the chief center of trade and commerce in the area, handling the rich harvests of eastern Bengal, collecting manufactures, especially cotton goods, for exports to the Ganges Valley, and overseas, and acting as distributor for the raw materials and imports following in. Indian and foreign merchants including Europeans came to Dhaka to do business. The organized European companies and the English, French, and Dutch also established their factories in the city. Later the organized European companies began to appear in Dhaka. Dhaka around this time began to export muslins (famous for its delicacy and thinness) to such remote places as Khurasan, indicating that already by 1640 North Indian and other Asiatic traders were doing business in Dhaka. These traders and merchants carried out their commercial activities on their own accounts and contributed significantly to the export trade of Dhaka to different parts of the world but also to the growth of the commercial enclaves of Dhaka.

By the 17th century, Dhaka was queen of the cities of Eastern India. Many beautiful palaces, mosques, gardens, markets, and amusement centers were built. The city became the meeting place of many people and interests from different corners of the globe. At the height of Mughal rule and prosperity, Dhaka city was estimated to have a population of some 900,000 - which today is 22,478,000. The city proper stretched seven to ten miles along the river Buriganga and up to two and a half miles inland. The suburbs extended from the Buriganga to the Tongi Bridge, 15 miles to the north, and from Mirpur-Jafarabad on the west, some ten miles east to Postogala.



The modernization process of Dhaka further increased with the establishment of the Dhaka Municipality in 1864. For decades, the municipality carried out various development works which eventually made Dhaka a modern city. These development works were mostly connected with the improvement of the communication system of the city, improvement of sanitation and health, drainage, and other civic amenities. The first major plan for the modernization of Dhaka was made in 1870 through an act. The act resolved to improve the road systems of the city, enhance beautification of the town, start the clearance of the slums, develop the sanitary system, undertake the supply of filtered water, install street lights and take health care.

In 1905, Dhaka became the capital again of a new province; namely, Eastern Bengal and Assam. Though this proved short-lived, Dhaka gained much in infrastructure and urban ways of life. By 1905, it had become

a divisional town with a reasonable population and vibrant economic activities. But it was not ready to become a capital city of the British Empire. Thus, extra measures were needed to upgrade it to a provincial capital. The context to which it became a capital, however, inspired the officials in charge to make it a memorable venture. A grand plan was adopted to bring back its past glory. That bright future came in 1947, when Dhaka again became the capital of the newly created province of East Pakistan after the British departed. As the capital of East Pakistan, Dhaka embarked upon the life of a modern city with planned development activities.

New areas were developed as commercial and business hubs and residential areas. Motijheel area developed as the new financial and commercial hubs of Dhaka, and New Market became the forerunner of the present-day shopping malls. Planned suburbs were started, leading to the present-day beautiful and modern - as well as expensive - areas of Banani, Gulshan, Baridhara, and Uttara. A new capital was built, called the Second Capital of Pakistan in Sher-e-Bangla Nagar, where the architecturally famous Parliament was constructed.





After independence in 1971, Dhaka also grew into the most important center of many other sectors of life like education, trade, commerce, and sports. From 1947, the educational growth of the city progressed steadily, but after 1971 it leaped forward dramatically, and at present Dhaka houses several public and private universities. Other than universities there are thousands of other categories of schools and colleges and special religious institutions. Many technical and medical institutions also have appeared. Dhaka is now the chief education center of the country. The literacy rate in Dhaka City Corporation areas was only 52.36 per cent in 1985. In 2011, the literacy rate improved to 74.55 per cent, which was above the national average literacy rate of 69.34 (BBS, 2014) per cent, which stands at about 74.91% today. Per the data in 2016, the city has hosted 8 public universities and 52 private universities (University Grant Commission, 2016).

Today, Dhaka has developed into one of the most important cultural centers of Asia, holding national and international art, music, cinema, theatre, dance, and literary conferences and festivals. Western-influenced theatrical performances started in the middle of the conservative Dhaka society in the 19th century. Today, theatre is the most popular entertainment in the city, though the organizers and performers are mostly from the educated middle class. The hub of these activities is the Segun Baghicha, Ramna Sanskritik Boley or the Dhaka Cultural Enclave. Shilpakala Academy, the Bangla Academy, the Bangladesh National Museum, the National Archives of Bangladesh, the Nazrul Institute, the Institute of Fine Arts, the Bulbul Academy of Fine Arts, and many other government and non-government organizations are playing their significant roles in this regard.

Very recently, Dhaka's name has appeared on the international sporting scenes, hosting international cricket, hockey, volleyball, and other games. In particular, the rise of Dhaka as a venue of international cricket competition has made the name of Bangladesh a talking point for millions across the world. The Mirpur Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium has been especially selected for this purpose. Dhaka's sprawl has never stalled throughout history, whether in tangible manner, in the form of expansion and development or in intangible silent influence it keeps exerting on the global scene!

University of Asia Pacific (UAP) was established in 1996 as a private university under the Private University act 1992, with a vision to enhance the opportunities for higher education in Bangladesh. University of Asia Pacific (UAP) has its permanent campus at 74/A, Green Road, Dhaka 1215, which provides 388,800 sq. ft. of space in an eleven storied building on slightly more than an acre of land. Besides, UAP has been allotted a land space of 2.65 acres, i.e., 160,32 kathas of land at road number 224, sector number 21 at RAJUK Purbachal Project, the biggest planned township in Bangladesh, for a larger permanent campus. Now UAP offers undergraduate programs in English, Law, Architecture, Business Administration, Civil Engineering, Computer Science and Engineering, Electrical and Electronic Engineering and Pharmacy, with 5069 students currently studying in different programs.

The curriculum of UAP has been approved by University Grants Commission (UGC) of the GoB. The University started its operation in 1996 and offered four years bachelor degree programs in Computer Science and Engineering and Business Administration. At present UAP offers undergraduate programs in nine disciplines and graduate programs in eight disciplines. UAP, sponsored by UAPF, a non-profit, non-commercial foundation based in Dhaka, Bangladesh. The principal aim of the Foundation is to promote human and social development through improve educational opportunities, innovative educational programs relevant to the needs of an emerging society and to develop skills, know-how and awareness of the youth through appropriate institutional grooming. The Foundation has been

established by a group of eminent educationists, industrialists, and administrators who share the same vision and social commitments. UAP is the first project of the foundation aimed at realizing these noble goals. The main objective of UAP is to provide high quality education at tertiary level relevant to the demands of a high-quality dynamic academia in Bangladesh. The courses and curricula are designed to enable and equip a student to enter into the national and international job market or pursue higher academic and professional goals with a solid academic foundation.

UAP has a multi-disciplinary research institute named Institute for Energy, Environment, Research Development (IEERD) to encourage and sponsor meaningful research activities by the teachers and students of the university. By this time IEERD has organized several seminars on Energy and Environment by nationally and internationally known speakers, including a three-day research and development exposition from July 19-21, 2012 UAP enjoys collaborative ties with a number of reputed foreign and national Universities, institutions of higher education and research in foreign countries, such as USA, Canada, Australia, Ireland, Japan and Latvia UAP organize curricular and co-curricular activities all the year round. Some of the recent events include International Conference on Computer and Information Technology (ICCIT) 2017, Association for Computing Machinery-International Collegiate Regional Programming Contest, 9th National Math Olympiad, Drama Festival on the birth anniversary of William Shakespeare and a number of other programs. UAP has a number of achievements both on the institutional and personal levels including



the award for ACI Outstanding University 2017. All engineering, architecture, pharmacy and law degrees are accredited by respective professional institutions such as Institute of Architects (IAB), Board of Accreditation for Engineering and Technical Education (BAETE), Bangladesh, Institute of Engineers Bangladesh (IEB), Pharmacy Council of Bangladesh, and Bangladesh Bar Council. UAP has been the first Bangladeshi private university which has become a member of the Association of Commonwealth Universities, UK.

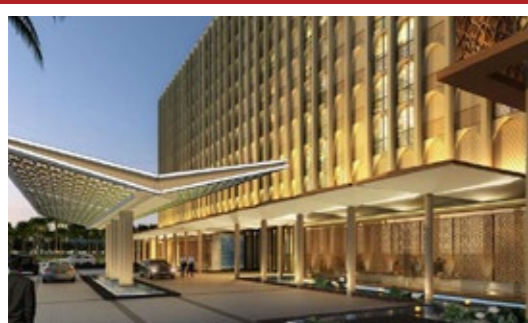
UAP is a member of American Chamber of Commerce (AmCham), the Association of Universities of Asia and the Pacific and International Association of University Presidents (IAUP). UAP has departmental student forums and clubs to carry out regular cultural activities and bring out student publications, wallpapers and souvenirs. UAP has provisions within the UAP campus for sports activities centrally as well as within each department. UAP provides high speed broadband internet connection to all the departments and the laboratories.

All the 8 (eight) undergraduate programs of UAP have been classified as 'Very Good' in a recent external peer review by teams consisting of international quality experts, subject specialists and UGC experts under Higher Education Quality Enhancement Project (HEQEP), a project of University Grants Commission of Bangladesh, with the assistance of the World Bank. UAP has recently formed a permanent center named 'Directorate of Students Welfare (DSWY) to enable students face the challenges of a highly competitive world outside. Its functions include assistance in job placement, organizing workshops, seminars,

training programs, career fairs and club fairs, supervising all the central clubs and counselling on physical and mental health issues.

The staff development programs at UAP support employee development by providing various trainings on relevant stream, seminars and workshops that enable the employees to improve performance.
